SENATOR MOSSEY: They never voiced their opinion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did the union come to you, or you went to the union?

SENATOR MOSSEY: It was both. They played a role in the development of this bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You told me that you...well, you told us that you went to them and explained to them that you would see that there's some training put in the bill, and would that take away their opposition. Now, if I'm misstating that, I'd like you to correct that.

SENATOR MOSSEY: When the bill was coming out, that's when I started talking to the leaders of the majority of law enforcement in Nebraska.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you initiated the conversations.

SENATOR MOSSEY: It happened one or two of the ways. You could be correct in that way. But eventually...I have a lot of friends in law enforcement, so it's not unusual for me to talk to them a lot.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, but I don't want to say what you did. You know...
