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the votes were in the committee to send the bill out here, they were going to do all they could to make it less bad, and therefore, when they got some things in that they wanted then they became neutral.

SENATOR MOSSEY: That would probably be a correct statement, I would assume.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now...that's all I will ask you at this time. Thank you, Senator Mossey. Members of the Legislature, often in law enforcement, people in law enforcement have a tendency to overstate a situation. And I believe in specifying it. And I believe in subjecting myself to questions on any issue I raise on the floor. The Latino Police Officers Association had to set up their own group because the white union does not represent their issues. The same with the black officers. And the white union has worked actively against what would be in the best interest of the black community and the black officers. In unity there is strength. So it would make sense to hitch your wagon to a bigger wagon if that wagon is going the direction you're going. But if it's not, you have to break off on your own. These two groups are the ones who are going to be confronted with circumstances where more guns is not a good prospect. And Senator Mossey may not know this, even though he worked in this Weed and Seed program. There are tremendous numbers of white people who come into the black community and who come into the Latino community, and they come there for nefarious reasons. I've lived there all my life, and I will never move. And I see them in their pickup trucks, in their SUVs, in their Jaguars, in their Mercedeses. And if any of you doubt this, I wouldn't give you a tour of my community. Just come down there and ask yourself, what are these people doing in the black community? And they will be allowed to carry guns, because they're the ones that Senator Mossey, Senator Tyson, Senator Aguilar feel ought to be able to tote these pistols, so when they go into a black community, for whatever purpose they're going there, they can be armed. And to us, they are dangerous. And when the day comes that they start coming armed in our community, you think that I'm going to sit idly by and let them come into our community and menace it? Now, if they're armed, how am I and other black people going to deal
