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who watch our discussions, and they wonder how and why, when these points are made, senators sit like knots on logs who say they support this bill and the Second Amendment, and the right for people to be carrying these pistols. I was asked yesterday if, under the helmet bill, somebody who's wearing a helmet, whether compelled or not, can conceal a pistol in a helmet? Yes they can. Yeah. And helmets can be made with little compartments to carry little derringers. Oh yes. See, they have daddy guns, mommy guns, and baby guns. They got guns for everybody. This bill would probably be opposed more by those who want to be toting these pistols, if they know what's in it, than the opposition I'm mounting now. Because if they get a permit, they cannot resort to the law that I can without a permit. They cannot have that permit and have alcohol on their breath, then say, but the law over here says if I can show a reason for carrying it, I can carry it. The prosecutor says, oh no. That law that you got the permit under explicitly exempts you from this other law over here. So whereas Chambers can carry one without a permit and have less restrictions on himself under the existing law, you put yourself under this law that puts greater restrictions on you and can make you in violation of the law under circumstances where Chambers, without a permit, cannot be found to be in violation of the law. You all didn't know that, did you?

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Because you didn't read the bill. You deal with what you call a concept. And this would be a good political position for you. But when these people start trying to get these permits, and these sheriffs have to start determining somebody's visual acuity, is the sheriff going to have to get a machine and be trained in determining visual acuity? Otherwise, how will it be determined? Will he hold up two fingers and say, how many fingers have I got up? And the guy says, well, sheriff, I just want to get a permit to carry a pistol; I wasn't told I have to be able to read and count. I don't know how many fingers you got up. Well, that doesn't determine visual acuity, but it says something about the intellect of some...and this bill doesn't say you have to read, write, and figure in order to get a permit to carry a gun. It
