SENATOR TYSON: I don't recall the specifics, Senator Thompson. But I am aware that I've been in several committee meetings with you in which people...I recall one about the history of doctors applying for certification in Nebraska.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yeah.

SENATOR TYSON: I remember that. But...

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. Well, that's okay. I wasn't trying to play "stump the senator" here. I just noticed that in the fiscal...I'm getting to the fiscal note on this bill that you passed out this morning. Senator Tyson? I think I've lost him again.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Tyson, are you done yielding?

SENATOR TYSON: Pardon?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Thompson has a question if you will yield.

SENATOR TYSON: Oh, yes, yes. Certainly.

SENATOR THOMPSON: I'm just referring to this particular amendment and the fiscal note that you handed out. I just have a few questions about it. So there's a database maintained by the Department of Health and Human Services that would be accessible to the sheriffs, or to the State Patrol?

SENATOR TYSON: No, it's only accessible to the State Patrol, and that would be part of the state criminal check.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. And the department...I guess I'm always astounded, because I...when the department says they can do something without any additional funding. But they're saying they can update this database to cover ten years without additional funding. Is that correct?
