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SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Thompson and Senator Tyson.
(Visitors introduced.) Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I now understand why Senator Tyson is lacking in so many respects when we're dealing with material on the floor. He deliberately refuses to listen to senators. And when you close your mind to learning, you can't learn anything. So if a little knowledge is a dangerous thing, imagine what no knowledge is. But at least he told you all that he doesn't pay attention. So now you can put into context what he says, that makes no sense and seems not to be connected with what we're talking to. I'd like to ask Senator Mossey a question or two.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Mossey.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Yes. Two? (Laugh)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Mossey, ...I said a question or two. Right. Sometimes they're divided into subsections,...

SENATOR MOSSEY: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...like NCAA rules. One rule, but about 13 subdivisions. (Laugh)

SENATOR MOSSEY: Exactly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When you were mentioning that the police union had...who transmitted to you the position of the police union in Omaha?

SENATOR MOSSEY: The...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I don't need a name. If that person has a position...

SENATOR MOSSEY: I don't like to give names without asking people. But the president of the Omaha Police Union and the president of the Omaha Police executive board.
