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SENATOR THOMPSON: Correct.

SENATOR TYSON: That research is already done. These are "assessment" fees. The FBI charges for every NCIC check. They charge \$23.

SENATOR THOMPSON: No, I understand that. Okay. Thank you, Senator Tyson. What I'm trying to get to is another issue. Senator Stuthman, could I ask you a question?

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Because you were a former county commissioner. And I'm just curious if you heard...ever heard this question asked or stated to you during budget discussions, by any person working for the county, or the rural officers of the county, elected officials: I'm going to need more money because a new law passed or a new requirement has been placed on me.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Yes. We have...in the county process, we have heard that numerous times. Because any time that additional labor is needed or additional staff is needed to perform the service, there is an additional cost. And we've heard that many times. And most of the times, we have given, you know, the sheriff's department the money for that. But there is additional cost. If something is added to an office, these offices are run on...in my opinion, and I've seen this in the county system,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: ...that they are running on a bare-bones budget already. And anything additional will require more funds needed to perform the service.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. I guess my concern about this particular fiscal note, which is what we're discussing, is, I can't say with any accuracy that any county board isn't going to be asked, because of additional work at the department or the analysis that has to happen about whether the
