SENATOR THOMPSON: ...if this is enough money for the county. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would yield my time to Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers, you have five minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, what I had said when I started talking is that Senator Tyson has motions on the underlying bill which, if he can get 29 members to go along with him, will prevent any discussion, any amendment on that bill. If that motion should be adopted, then this atrocity will be moved on across the board. And the Governor said he would sign it. I want to have put into the record problems in this bill. I want to have stated over and over for the record the opposition from the police chiefs, the opposition from the sheriffs, and the fact that there is no law enforcement group that favors this bill. Senator Mossey did correct the record, based on something I had suggested he said. He did not say the police union favors the bill. He said they were neutral on the bill. During our discussion the last time I was speaking, I was asking Senator Mossey how the head of the police union determined the, quote, feeling, unquote, of the membership. There was no poll taken. There is no evidence of any kind to substantiate what that man told Senator Mossey. But Senator Mossey has promised to get a definite number. Before I misstate again, I'd like to ask Senator Mossey a question.
