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SENATOR TYSON: Yes.

SENATOR THOMPSON: And the state...in the first permitting, the \$100, the split was so the state would recover the cost of the criminal history record check. Is that...?

SENATOR TYSON: Plus, right now, about \$17 additional.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Well, it's \$33 plus \$17.

SENATOR TYSON: Thirty-three from fifty is seventeen.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Right.

SENATOR TYSON: Yes.

SENATOR THOMPSON: So when the permit...

SENATOR TYSON: And the \$50 goes to the county to...

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...when the permit is renewed,...

SENATOR TYSON: ...compensate the sheriff.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...what is the...why is the state getting half?

SENATOR TYSON: The state isn't getting half of the renewal. The county...

SENATOR THOMPSON: Well, where does it say...?

SENATOR TYSON: ...gets the renewal. The state is not doing anything on the renewal.

SENATOR THOMPSON: That's...well, that's what I'm trying to figure out. Okay. So I've got, the state isn't doing anything. The sheriffs...so where does it say for the second...for the renewal, that that stays totally with the county?
