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SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Tyson, would you yield to Senator Thompson's question, please?

SENATOR TYSON: Yes, Senator...Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR THOMPSON: How will the sheriff know...I'm getting back to the renewal of the permit. If there isn't...if a person moves into the state, or moves...commits a crime in another state that may or may not be conveyed to the local sheriff, how does he stay in compliance to know whether they're...without the criminal history record check being done a second time, to know whether or not there's been a crime committed outside of the state of Nebraska for a concealed permit carrier?

SENATOR TYSON: I'm not too sure I understand your question, Senator Thompson,...

SENATOR THOMPSON: Well, let me back up.

SENATOR TYSON: ...in that, if someone who is a resident in Nebraska goes to another state and commits a crime...now, then there's a procedure that has to be followed in committing that crime. In other words, he has to be arrested, he has to be indicted, he has to be tried. And your question then is, does the sheriff of this county know about it? I would assume in the process of indicting and trying him, yes, he would.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Well, we have people who are watching this on TV. And my office was called by a law enforcement officer who said that you need...at the renewal point, a local sheriff's office won't have information, necessarily, outside the state, unless for some reason that person...and this...the person who called didn't say this part. But said, you really need, for the renewal process, to assure that the person hasn't had another crime committed in some other state that may not...you need to have the federal criminal history check by the State Patrol to assure that, that a local sheriff's office doesn't have information from all the states available to them.

SENATOR TYSON: Pursuing that line of enquiry, Senator Thompson,
