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actors. We talked about these type of folks throughout the last three months. I find it hard to believe...if a company...I don't like to toss out names...West teleservices...I'll do it anyway...West teleservices, for example. They established this type of stuff before the federal government even thought about doing it. Their clients are dealing with this type of environment, just because of what West has established on their own. Now, sure, are they getting pressure from customers, people like me that don't like getting those calls at home? Absolutely. But I think the private sector has taken on some of this role. The business sector, I should say. Another thing that I had mentioned yesterday, and I didn't really delve too much into it, is technology. I get five or six of those calls a day. I stare at the phone and just don't even answer it. I mean, it's a red flag flying up. I mean, we're talking about things, almost, I believe, in about a year, that they could potentially be obsolete. And we're asking folks to pay for something that could...that they may not need two years from now. I guess that's my point. I...the last thing that I really wanted to say about it...and I...again, I touched on it in the line of questioning yesterday. Fraudulent behavior. I don't know that we had enough time to get the question answered. How is this going to solve that...if there are five guys in a garage with a phone trying to collect money for some, you know, sheriff's department that they have no idea whether it exists or not, but that's not their goal, their goal is to just grab some money and move on, how is this going to stop them? They can call Skyline Manor. They can call places where folks would be extremely susceptible to that type of behavior. I'm concerned about a few of the things. The fraudulent behavior is one of them. I guess I would return the rest of my time to the Chair. And thank you very much.
