SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam Chairman, members of the body, I want to build on something that Senator Bourne said. They want it. They want...our people in our district want to have...not bothered by the calls. I think the other part that they want (laugh) is they don't want to pay for it. I get complaints on two things in my district: one, about property tax; and the other thing is about taxes on telephones. If you look at your telephone, there's lots of taxes. And so I think, Senator Bourne, I was not paying much attention to this little bill that came out of the Transportation Committee. But I think he's making lots of sense. Why do we have to duplicate something that the federal government will do for us? Do we want another bill on...another line on our telephone bill? Is that what we want? Or can we wait? Senator Beutler, you had this bill, or maybe Senator Smith, or Senator Baker. What...Senator Baker...or, Senator Smith?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Baker?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Or, Senator Smith is going to answer my...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh. Senator Smith, would you yield?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Why don't we put it, if the federal government does it, then this goes away? Would that be okay?

SENATOR SMITH: Well, I want to correct something. This has absolutely nothing to do with a phone bill. There will not be \$3 on a phone bill. That was mentioned yesterday. And I don't know where that came from, unless that's an intended killer amendment. I mean, the fact is, it's a \$3 subscription fee in the green copy. And I'm even looking to get rid of that with an amendment, and referring to the federal list. But...now, what was your question? (Laughter)

SENATOR HARTNETT: (Laugh) My question is, Senator Smith, if the federal law goes in...because I think that's why we had back that...you know, the...Senator Beutler had the bill back,...Senator Stuhr said back in 1999 we didn't need it then
