consumer protection. And we need to decide what we want to do about charitable organizations. Some of the bills that came to the committee this year had included them, and some had not. That's another big question that you'll want to answer. And we can have a set of, hopefully, consensus amendments at Select File, but in any event, I hope, refined down to one or two things that you'll want to decide that perhaps we don't get decided through the process of negotiation. But I'm guessing, given the attitudes of everybody involved in this matter, that we're going to settle all of them by negotiation. Because I think there is an underlying...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...consensus now, and some further understanding about how this all relates, and what consumers in this state do want. And I assure you again, there will be no more popular bill in the Legislature than this one. The consumers want the protection. I think we want to give it to them. I think it's our job to figure out how to do that most efficiently. And I think we'll get there. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the closing on the committee amendments. The question is the adoption of AM0715 to LB 743. All in favor vote aye; all opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 5 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The committee amendment is adopted. We are now back to the discussion of the bill. Are there further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senator Smith would move to amend.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Smith to open on your amendment.

SENATOR SMITH: Madam President, I would like to have that laid over till Select File, please.
