of, we're going to get it to you for free, isn't true, because they're paying for it now. The question is, if there is duplication, should they pay for both? And the answer to that, in my opinion, is no. I think that's the answer from Senator Smith, Senator Baker. But at this time, there is no formal process in place from our friends in the federal government to be able to put yourself on a no-call list, at least until July. And then it won't be implemented, as I'm told, until October. So I think we can draft this bill that would address some of the concerns in the event that there is duplication. I can think we can work through those between now and Select File. Yeah, I'm not overwhelmingly excited about everything in this either. But I think it's shortsighted and I think we fail the citizens of this state if we do not advance the bill and at least try and work out these details, and try and work with our friends in Washington. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Baker, you are recognized to speak.

SENATOR BAKER: I would call the question, please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. The question is...do we call the question? Does debate cease? All those in favor say aye; all those opposed say no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Debate has ceased. The proponent of the bill, the introducer of the bill, Senator Smith, you are recognized to close on advancement of LB 743.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Madam President. I would ask for a call of the house while I'm closing.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, to place the house
