SENATOR SCHIMEK:      The house is under call. Would all members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Smith, did you wish to be recognized to close?

SENATOR SMITH:      Yes please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK:      Proceed.

SENATOR SMITH:      Thank you, Madam President and members. I hate to repeat myself, but I do want to cover some issues here in the closing. And certainly the issue of the size of government has been brought up, and I think that that's important to note. Certainly we don't want to add things when we don't need to. But when we need to, I believe it is our responsibility. And that's why I introduced LB 743. And I appreciate a lot of work that's been done on this by the committee. Senator Beutler has done a lot of work on this as well. But when we hear about phone bills and phone lines and phone numbers and blocking and caller ID, the reality is, if you want to not be called, or you want to look at caller ID, the reality is, yes, that's a fee on your phone bill. We're not look...we're not talking about the phone bill here in this bill, because...in LB 743. Because it would be an optional thing. Even if the green copy is ultimately the version that is adopted, that's an optional thing. And we're working on a situation to make it so there isn't even a three-dollar fee. But let's talk about what the federal government is doing and what they haven't done. And Senator Redfield brought up some points. And she said it was free to citizens for the federal list. And obviously, I don't want to go into that, because we pay federal taxes. The sad thing is, we've been paying federal taxes for how long, when the federal government has been saying that they will do something, and now they're kind of forwarding a half portion that has a long list of exemptions. And when Senator Redfield says, if we're going to do something we better do it right, I totally agree. It would be very disingenuous for us to say, well, the federal government is doing something, but you're still going to get called till who knows when by nonprofit organizations
