SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schrock, while you're getting to your microphone, are you going to support further transfers from this fund in the next year or two?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Bromm, I have no idea how to answer that one.

SPEAKER BROMM: Well, I think at some point somebody has to stand up and say, this is a program that has been very, very important, not only for this generation but future generations, and our well supplies to our towns as well as private individuals, and at some point, someone has to say we're going to take care of this program and we're not going to just look at it as a slush fund. And I'm not going to do that today. I understand the difficulties of taking this money out of either side of the lottery fund. I understand the immediacy of the problem, and I would resist it, even though it's only \$300,000,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SPEAKER BROMM: ...if I thought there was another option or if I thought the problem wasn't so eminent and so serious. I won't resist it, and I say that, but I will say this and I will do my best to prevent further transfers from this fund unless someone can show me that this program can function and proceed with cleanup in a timely way without more money, unless you want a tax increase. If you want to raise...if you want to put on another penny for this fund, then you can do some more transferring if you can continue the integrity of the fund. But we can't just keep willy-nilly taking money out of this thing and expect us not to be here two years from now redfaced wondering why we're back in the soup again with no money to take care of the programs. So I want to...I just want to get that on the record, and if I'm here...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SPEAKER BROMM: ...that's going to be my position. Thank you.
