involved in the decision making process. He provided the service in his local region, with the counties that were involved with his region. And again, I can't emphasize this enough, that each region...excuse me, each region, will take the funds generated from fees accumulated through the probation supervision and develop a program of rehabilitation tailored to this group, tailored to probationers and parolees. I have had opportunity, both in my position as probation officer and my current position, to witness what Region 6 does in the drug court program in Douglas County. Unbelievable work. They have a track of treatment involved for this group, which is, obviously, a presentence group, that were...they enroll into a drug treatment program, supervised by the region, tailored by the region, so that they can avoid a criminal conviction. And what a wonderful job they do. And the success rate is through the roof. The success rate is through the roof with that drug court program at Douglas County. I want to do that throughout the state. That's what my amendment attempts to do. I want that to go across the state. It's really simple. Do we want to fund treatment as part of community corrections? And I'll say it again. The only way this is going to be successful is if we have appropriate funding for treatment. You know, if we move forward on this now, we're going to miss an opportunity. And I don't want this opportunity missed. Treatment is an important part of this whole concept. As I said earlier, regions throughout the state are supportive.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: I've had opportunity to speak to each individual region director, all six regions. I personally spoke with them. It wasn't staff. It wasn't staff. It was me. I called them. And to put it lightly, they support it. They're 100 percent behind this concept. They think it will work. They endorse it, and they welcome it. And the counties throughout the state will welcome participation in a community corrections community. I think they will welcome it as well. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
