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to have that as a part of what we pass, rather than just assuming that this won't be in the final agreement. It's currently in the draft agreement.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR PREISTER: Whether it will make it to the final agreement, whether we will still be operating under Wisconsin laws, we don't know that, but it's in the draft agreement. It hasn't been signed, but it's right here already. And if it is signed, then it's too late, folks. We've granted the authority in statute and, after that, we've said it goes with our blessing. The reason I'm raising it and have continued to raise things, I'm still discovering things in this agreement. There are likely other things in here that I haven't even seen the consequences of yet, and at this point, before we pass this on Final Reading, I think it deserves merit. I think it deserves some modification. This amendment doesn't take away the indemnification. It doesn't hurt the bill.

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I guess I think that if a bill needs to be amended on Final Reading, it needs to be amended, and you don't let the bill just sail along without at least considering it. Now, I'm listening to Senator Preister and I think that he has some legitimate points and I hope that people don't dismiss his concerns because we're on Final Reading. This is the third stage for consideration of a bill, and if we need to take that bill back to Select File then let's do it. But I have a sense that people aren't listening to what he's saying, and I think that we should be listening. I don't know if he's right or not, but I think he's making some very good arguments and we ought to at least consider returning this bill to Select File so that we can hear those arguments and so that other people who have the opposite point of view perhaps, we can hear from them as to why this isn't a good idea.
