SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR PREISTER: ...the limitation that we really need to look at in passing it, and we will have that additional opportunity. And I say that...I don't see Senator Erdman next to his microphone, but I stand in support of his amendment, even though on the last bill on Final Reading he didn't support mine. (Laughter) Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Schimek, on the motion to return. She waives that opportunity. Senator Erdman, there are no other lights on wishing to speak. You may close on your motion to return LB 305 for specific amendment.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, if we could have the members check in, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: We are on Final Reading so, Senators, please check in, as requested. Members, please check in. Senator Erdman, your time is running.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. I'll go ahead and begin as individual...as members are getting to their seats. Let me take a moment and explain to you what's going to happen. If you vote to return this bill for a specific amendment, we bring the bill off of Final Reading to Select File. I'll offer my amendment, AM1033, which we've debated already, vote up or down. I would prefer you vote up, obviously. Then the bill is going to either stay on Select File or go to Final Reading, and at a later date we could potentially offer another amendment. Now it might be related to mine, and it might not, and the reason why I say that is this. This is the only bill that we have before us. Senator Schrock has railroaded all the other Game and Parks bills through, very successfully, so this is our last opportunity in the event of budget debates, in the event of any other discussion that might come out of any other bills or ideas, for us to address Game and Parks issues, because a majority of them are going to end up in this area of law, which
