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even though I understand your dilemma. But if you're elected in November, in essence, you're supposed to move to...how long are you going to have to move to that district?

SENATOR BAKER: You'd have to...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Sixty days?

SENATOR BAKER: You'd have to be there before you were sworn in the office.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And what constitutes living there?

SENATOR BAKER: Maintain your primary residence in that commissioner's district.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Is that in the bill? Or is that (inaudible)?

SENATOR BAKER: No, that's not in the bill. But that's under other requirements of permanent residency.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I wouldn't have thought so much about this, but as I recall this NRD situation, in the Lower Platte North I think it was, where he was elected for a long time, and it took lots of effort to finally determine that that couldn't happen. And I'm a little reluctant to do this, frankly. And so I just...

SENATOR BAKER: Well, the...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...have some comments about it.

SENATOR BAKER: It's on your time. But the section that applies to the commissioners is very specific. It is county commissioners, not NRD board members.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I understand.

SENATOR BAKER: Strictly commissioners. The other part of it's down in Chapter 32, and that's dealing with nonresidency. If it's not required, you do not have to be a resident of that
