SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, I...that's my point. I guess I just don't understand why the difference. It would seem to me that even if it is just a county commissioner, they should live in the district before you vote them in to represent you.

SENATOR BAKER: I think the reason this was brought...well, it came out of Red Willow County. And the reason being, it's hard to find people in these small rural counties...and Red Willow County isn't even my rural county...but it's hard to find people to run for a commissioner's job in the first place. And there's people hesitant to move to a district to run for it without being elected first, in the case of county commissioners. And I have to reemphasize that this applies only to county commissioners in this case here. This is in Chapter 23. The rest of the bill, in 32, is a different situation. That's for registration requirements.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Okay. Well, I'll listen to the rest of the debate. But I'm not so sure I can support this bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Stuthman, followed by Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members of the body. I also have a question for Senator Baker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: This deals only with county commissioners and not with supervisors at the present time, right?

SENATOR BAKER: That's correct.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Is there anything in the bill that would lead to that...if a supervisor...a supervisor at the present time has to live in the district, in the district to file for an office,
