SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so your intent is that if somebody has currently a garage that's fixed to open to an alley...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: And I'm sorry, the 15 minutes has elapsed. According to Rule 5, Section 6, sub (d), we will take a vote on the advancement of LB 97 without any further debate or closure. All in favor of the advancement of LB 97 vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on advancement of LB 97. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 97 does advance. (Visitors introduced.) Mr. Clerk, next bill.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 258 was introduced by Senator Bromm. (Read title.) Bill was read for the first time on January 13, referred to the Banking Committee. That committee reports the bill to General File with committee amendments. (AM0532, Legislative Journal page 804.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, to open on the advancement of LB 258.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. LB 258 was introduced to allow a little bit of flexibility with small accounting offices that have...that maybe serve more than one community or attempt to serve more than one community, particularly probably small communities. But the bill, as it was originally introduced, would allow...currently, the law provided that any office established for the practice of public accountancy would be under the supervision of a manager and that manager could
