SENATOR AGUILAR: Actually, that's the part that makes the drug courts effective.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Aguilar, is it...

SPEAKER BROMM. One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...true what I said? Well, never mind. Members of the Legislature, you cannot find another place in statute where, in effect, you create an independent jailable offense where a person hasn't been convicted of an offense. This person in drug court has not been tried or convicted of anything, but some judge out in Senator Aguilar's area apparently wants the authority to put people in jail who have not been convicted of an offense. Now I don't know many people even among the terrorists who said that's what America is going to do. Now they might arrest people without charge, but they're not going to say you sentence them to jail without having been convicted. That is intolerable. It should not be done, and this bill has no merit. They have...

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the drug court's...oh, you said time?

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Aguilar, if I could ask you a few questions. I'm...

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...I'm not approaching this from having made up my mind at all at this point, but I'm trying to understand how it fits in with the regular judicial system or doesn't fit in or what the difference is. First of all, this drug court program, it just says...it talks about supervised by a court. I
