punished for something he or she did not do, it's cruel. You can only be punished by jail, in this country, by a court in this way, is if you committed a crime. Now, Senator Aguilar says he's got to have that. He doesn't have to have it. The drug courts don't have to have it. He's got some numbskull judge out there who shouldn't even be a judge if he is so dumb that he doesn't understand the law any better than Senator Aguilar is suggesting that he doesn't understand it.
