Aguilar. I...I'll just continue to think about it, get feedback from people who are involved in the program, and try to resolve what I still think is a dilemma for me personally on voting for this bill. But I would be happy to give you back some time now if you would so choose.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Aguilar, you have four minutes and 20 seconds.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you, Senator Schimek. I appreciate the conversation. You've asked some very pointed questions that really need to be asked. Also, I want to state, just make an announcement that I was speaking to Judge Teresa Luther on the phone during the lunch hour, and she couldn't help but share with me that they just recently had a person finish the drug court program, give birth...not finish the drug court program, because they haven't graduated yet. But she was involved in the drug court program, gave birth to a drug-free baby, where without this program that baby would have been born addicted to drugs. This is a wonderful program, folks. It works. I understand there may be some problems with it. But I'm willing to work with anybody on this floor, especially Senator Chambers, because I appreciate his knowledge in the subject matter, to try to make this bill better. Like I said, I already agree, and I wholeheartedly think his amendments are a good one. I think they make the bill better. And I would accept them. Thank you.
