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is the one who is creating the difficulty in terms of what may or may not be done?

SENATOR AGUILAR: I don't believe so, Senator. Most...all the discussions I've had have been with Judge Luther. And she did in fact come down and testify.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, what did Judge Luther say there is that creates a problem for her, when this problem does not exist in other counties that have the same type of program as yours?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Well, it's her belief that that problem could exist.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And was...did she ever talk to you about Judge Livingston, or another judge, raising the question as to whether or not these things can properly be done that are being done out there? Did she mention...?

SENATOR AGUILAR: I'm told yes, but I don't remember that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you have confidence in whoever told you yes?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then can we accept the notion that this did not originate with Judge Luther, but she was the one designated to testify about it?

SENATOR AGUILAR: That's very possible.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I just wanted that clear. Now, are you telling me that Judge Luther and others are putting people in jail for not complying with the provision of this program? Is that what they're doing?

SENATOR AGUILAR: I don't know that they have done that yet. But I know that they're very concerned about it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if they're not doing it, what concerns
