I'm not aware of bonds being used for purposes other than that. But I don't know everything, so Senator Brashear may be aware of some other uses such as this. But I'm not.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. Then if I might ask Senator Brashear, basically, if this is a departure on previous ways that we have used bonds, Senator Brashear?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. Speaker. Senator Schimek, we use bonds for appearances, and we use bonds for costs, to ensure costs and the payment of costs. This would be a creative and new use of a bond, I think.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. I think you're right. And I don't know why none of us has been talking about this particular aspect of it. But that is how you could get somebody in jail without any previous conviction. Because this bond has been issued, and they've agreed to the provisions. And if they violate the provisions, then the bond will be...I don't know, call it invoked, or whatever. But the bond will be called. And so that's how they do it. And Senator Beutler, I know you and Senator Brashear weren't done with your conversation. Would you like the rest of my time? I'm guessing there's a couple minutes left maybe.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I appreciate that, but I need to look at a couple statutes first, to carry on the conversation...
