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call that to your attention. If this bill is not passed, nothing changes with the drug courts. Nothing. No drug court goes away. Judge Luther, based on my information, Senator Aguilar, is not the one raising questions and issues about the way things are done, but rather another judge.

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let these judges get together and work it out among themselves, and not bring it to the floor and take up all our time. But since it's out here, I'm going to take all the time it needs. And I don't believe Senator Aguilar can get 33 votes to shut me up on something like this, and then advance it. He might can get 33 votes to shut me up, so that the body can proceed to kill it. And that's what I think would happen. Because I don't think the body is of a mind, even if we strike that part about the jail time, to accept something like what we have here. Just the drafting is not good. And Senator Schimek, the reason I hadn't gotten over to the bond, that's on page...what is it, 4 or 6? Anyway, I haven't gotten past page 3. So you're way over on page 6, which is subsection (5). So I hadn't been able to get there yet. But she did raise...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a question that we would have to discuss. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, there are no other lights on. You may close on FA1306 to FA1304.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, what this amendment does...because I think you ought to adopt it...is to first strike the words "within the court system" that are found in line 15. Those words are not necessary, because everything involved with this bill and Senator Beutler's amendment is done within the court system. We don't need those words. The second part of the amendment would say, after the word "recidivism," in line 16, there is no period
