school if they're still in school, and test clean. They test three times a week to make sure they test clean. If not, they are...there are sanctions that they have to go through. And it's an 18-month process. At the end of the 18 months, if they graduate, their record stays clean and they get on with a better life. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Senator Hartnett, why don't you give us a short review of your amendment to LB 454 before we start discussion.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President and members of the body, what my amendment does, it leaves into the bill Section 1, which kind of gives the intent language that we will have drug courts in the state. And then it leaves that the drug courts...then in Section 2, a very...just one sentence: drug court programs shall be subject to rules which are promulgated by the Supreme Court for procedures to be implemented in the administration of such programs. And that's what the amendment does. It simply starts the process that we have drug courts as part of our system. And as it is right now, Senator Aguilar told me that there's seven courts, drug courts. And what I've heard is that most...we would have more drug courts. They're normally done by acting district judges. In our case, in Sarpy County, they're done by a juvenile judge. Sarpy County is looking at doing one with a district judge. But my amendment will simply limit it. We'll get rules and regulations, and hopefully more drug courts will be in. And I think Senator Aguilar supports my amendment. And that's what amendment does.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. We now continue floor debate on the Hartnett amendment, FA1308, to LB 454. Order to speak is Senator Hartnett, Senator Aguilar. Senator Hartnett. He waives his opportunity to speak. Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes. Thank you, Mr. President, members. I'd just like to confirm what Senator Hartnett said. I do support his amendment.
