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Select File, and we'd like to have that opportunity to do that. I'd like to thank Senator Hartnett for bringing this amendment, and encourage the body to support it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Further discussion on the Hartnett amendment, FA1308. Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, Mr. President, members. A question for Senator Hartnett, or perhaps Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Hartnett?

SENATOR FOLEY: We have drug courts operating today. And under your amendment, if I read it correctly, they have to be subject now to rules promulgated by the state Supreme Court. Correct?

SENATOR HARTNETT: The...yes, that's what...

SENATOR FOLEY: So how would they...I mean, in the interim, while those rules are being promulgated, the amendment seems to suggest that they can't operate without those rules.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I think...my...Senator Foley,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah. I...this is...and Senator Aguilar can respond. I think they are operating now as they will continue to operate until there are rules promulgated by the Supreme Court. So I think they would operate as they're doing right now. I don't see any stop of the courts, in my opinion. Senator Aguilar, maybe you want to...

SENATOR FOLEY: Senator Aguilar, do you have anything further to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, I would. Thank you for the question, Senator Foley. Right now, the drug courts will continue to operate. There's no question about that. They'll continue to
