\$10 million. That's where we're talking about a lot of money.

SENATOR VRTISKA: I understand that. And I certainly concur that this is the idea of the program. And I think it's a worthwhile effort that you've undertaken. And that's why I signed on to the bill, and that's why I support it. I think...I just want to clarify for the body and myself the fact where the money comes from, and if, in fact, if federal would not come forward, we could continue the program, but it would have to be more supported by the state or the local community or the county. And that's important to understand. But at this point it's not anything to worry about. But we don't know what the future brings. But I still agree that there's a savings here, because of the fact that the cost of incarceration is certainly much, much, much more than what we're talking about. So I support the amendment. I support the bill. And with that, Mr. President, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Dwite Pedersen.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I'm a little frustrated after reading the paper this morning, and some other things that I've...that happened in the last 24 hours. But I want to talk to drug courts just a little bit, but mostly about what the last two people just said about money. Drug courts I have seen save a lot of people from going to prison. And if you've ever been to one of them graduations, to see the success, it's absolutely out of this world. That I agree with every one of you. And I've seen it. It works. But when we say it's saving \$25,000 an inmate, I don't know where that comes from. Because that prison is full, and nobody is getting out of it, and we're putting more in there, at \$25,000 apiece. Don't talk savings to me when we keep shoving that prison plum full of people, because we're not saving a dime. We're setting up another program that obviously works, but I don't see the savings. The Appropriations Committee put the Work Ethic Camp and the juvenile facility back in their budget because it's a wonderful program. I'm not saying it's not a wonderful program. But that puts the cost right back where it was, and we are short all these hundreds of
