Mr. Du Pont said, Senator, not all of us. He knew that not everybody on that floor, and probably nobody on that floor,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...experienced poverty in his or her life, but through his or her constituents...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Your time is up, Senator Chambers. I'm sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hartnett, followed by Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, if you look at the committee statement, I'm one of the people that did support this bill in committee, because look at what we're doing here. The minimum wage right now is \$4.25, and then we hear the argument that, you know, oh, that will affect the other people above us, and that's...to me, that's...we need that if we're going to get people to move up the chain to pay income tax, pay...like Senator Chambers said, to spend their disposable income. They have more of it. I did have some sympathy, Senator Cunningham, for the grocers. I was moved by their testimony and so I would offer on Select File probably a subminimum wage, some states have that for workers, or a training wage, which would handle the...that would not only fit with the grocers but with other industry. So I...it, you know, someone said, well...and we also heard from the people that were opposed to the bill in committee, wait till the feds do it. You know, well, we...with Senator Chambers' bill, we kind of broke out the other day of doing something with the NCAA, with football players, that we're trying to take a leadership role in, and so I think maybe this is a chance for us to do with the minimum wage, is to break out and set a new pattern as far as wage is concerned. Because we've got to help people get off the poverty level, and I think this is a start. Senator Beutler, if you would like the rest of my time, if I could give my time to Senator Beutler, Mr. Chairman.
