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SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Which pays the higher wages, Wal-Mart or little businesses?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Little businesses.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, what role does minimum wage play in that, in that dynamic you and I are discussing as to why Wal-Mart will run a little business out of business? Does the minimum wage come into play in that dynamic?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: I wouldn't think so in that dynamic, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then Wal-Mart has probably caused some small businesses, where they've set up, to go out of business. Is that true?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: That's true, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what becomes of the people who are working for that small business? What do they do?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, that's where the problem comes. They have to leave the area.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, who works for Wal-Mart then? I'm sure they don't operate with robots.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Wal-Mart doesn't have as many employees, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But where do the employees come from that they get?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, some of them come from the rural areas.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Then, if these people have to leave that community, they're not leaving it because of the minimum
