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used to be with the head of the NCAA who bought a great big farm down in Texas to retire to. Family is the thing that catches people's attention, but they don't analyze what's behind it. It could be somebody with enough territory to cover half of Nebraska as a spread, but a family runs it so it's a family farm. Some people in this state are angry with Ted Turner because he's buying up a lot of property in Nebraska. Why get angry? He's a big shot. He has money. Isn't it his money to do with what he pleases? But because...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...some of your constituents say that the market value of that land is being artificially inflated because of what Ted Turner is willing to pay, therefore, you're upset with Ted Turner, you are going against what you say in other contexts, such as today where you fall down and worship everything any businessperson says. Ted Turner is a businessperson. Why don't you not only support what he's doing but advocate for it and tell him come to Nebraska and buy more land? The only way he can buy it is to put some money in somebody's pocket. He's not sticking a gun to any of these people's head out there and taking their land. He's giving them money and they're taking the money and giving up the land because they want to. There is so much inconsistency and contradiction among Nebraska people, because I think the education system is so inferior that people are not taught to think. They cannot put two things together and make sense out of them. They get confused.

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.
