Redfield, I did get your handout with respect to the distribution of workers affected by a proposed \$6.65 minimum wage. And maybe I should ask you about that, because I want to look at that, because it appears to be contradictory to the information that I gave you. So one of us needs to discover whose information is correct in that instance, and I'm very concerned about that. But where did...this came from the Employment Policies Institute? Is that right? I would ask Senator Redfield to...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator Redfield, would...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...respond.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...you respond?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes. You're correct. It came from the Employment Policies Institute, and it was based...if you look down at the bottom, it says the data where it was compiled from and the dates...the outgoing rotation groups of the current population survey.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And it assumes a proposed \$6.65 minimum wage increase.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Is that...is this prepared...

SENATOR REDFIELD: This was the proposal that...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...in response to a proposal at the federal level?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator, Ted Kennedy is proposing a minimum wage increase at the federal level to \$6.65. And this would be the number of people affected by that in Nebraska, with that data.

SENATOR VRTISKA: One minute.
