And this is a real concern that I have. Yes, I am totally in agreement that we should try to get as many people weaned from these programs as possible. But in this instance, in this situation, we are not giving them any kind of an incentive to try to get off of that type of a program. They would like to earn more money, but like I said, they can't, because they'll give it all away. So they just stay home and stay with their child, and don't have to pay the baby-sitter. So realistically, I think this is something that has to also be looked at. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I yield my time to Senator Beutler.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Beutler, you have 4 minutes and 50 seconds.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Redfield, let me have a little exchange with you, if I might.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Redfield, would you yield?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Your amendment leaves Senator Chambers' amendment, raising it from...or reducing it from 80 to \$5.45, as far as the immediate change is concerned, and then reduces the \$6.30 to \$5.75 for the second change. Is that right?

SENATOR REDFIELD: That's correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And if we do that amendment, are you okay in terms of supporting the bill?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes, I will support that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Well, let me say that I appreciate very much your looking for compromise and looking for a way to make this work. I also was interested in your suggestion earlier
