SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would advise Senator Mines, Senator Cunningham, Senator Stuhr and Senator Janssen to cluck and chortle and feel good now while they've got everything going their way, they think. But what is happening this morning is not going to be the way the rest of the session will go. Senator Cunningham may be made to feel like a hero for putting all his personal business before the Legislature and the state, but you don't see those praising him for doing it doing it themselves. Senator Stuhr hasn't done it. Senator Mines hasn't done it. Nobody is showing how pitiful and pathetic their existence is as an argument to establish a policy for the state. Now if Senator Cunningham was an advocate for others, I could readily understand that. And anybody on this floor is free to advocate any position he or she chooses, even a personal one. They can come in here and tell who they went to bed with last night if they are so tasteless but are of a mind to do it. So if there are people who feel they should spread their personal business on the public record, let them do it. And if there are those who enjoy a feeling of heady triumph by defeating a modest increase in the minimum wage, such as is proposed in the current form of this bill, if that's the best they can get this session let them have it, I suppose, and let them enjoy it. But there are not going to be issues throughout this session where everybody is going the way Senator Cunningham, Senator Mines, and Senator Stuhr want. And I'm glad that I did listen carefully to Senator Stuhr, who talked about not increasing the cost of certain things, because she was talking to me about raising some fees. So I know she's changed her mind on that and certainly is not going to try to get that done. Life is like a seamless web. Spiders who build those circular webs manage to do it in such a way that a disturbance on the farthest right-hand edge of the web will be transmitted throughout the web, all the way to the left-hand side, the upper side and the lower side. So if you're the kind of person who sees life as a seamless web, everything interconnects with and affects everything else. So I'm listening very carefully to my colleagues. I am being instructed and I believe that when knowledge comes, action should follow it. And we also can get a transcript of everything that was said in case, in another context, people want to deny some of the comments that they have made. But I am for an increase in the minimum wage.
