I don't know why it is, and I don't understand the numbers, that whenever we do something like this it ratchets up and everybody gets an increase. But I'll tell you why I support LB 435, and, yes, support LB 435, and will reject the bracket motion, because I for one in here can name you, and maybe not name them all, but I can have come to mind at least 50 people in the last year that I know personally that I've worked with who work for and only get paid the minimum wage.
