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One of the comments was that we have lots of people on...that are poor. We have...and I'm sure we probably do. I don't know. Lots of people means something different to me than it does to Senator Pedersen. But if my math is correct, I look at the number, and I think we're...those of us that have been...in talking about raising the minimum wage for primary head of household or a household with a child, we start with a figure, a high figure, of there are 20,000 individuals in Nebraska, according to Senator Beutler, that are paid minimum wage. And then he suggested there are about 40 percent of those that are head of household or household with a child. So if we take 40 percent of 20,000 people, his high side, that's 8,000 individuals. Now we don't know if there are other means of income in that family, but let's take the 8,000 people. There are, in Nebraska, 503,000 workers. Ladies and gentlemen, we're talking about 1.6 percent of the workers that are head of household making minimum wage. We don't know if others in that household are also earning an income. So I would suggest that a lot of people that this will help in the terms that we're discussing is not necessarily a lot of people in my point of view. Now one person is too many that can't pull themselves up and that...I think that we as a state have an obligation to help expand them and help them get off of minimum wage, but that's also their responsibility too. And to paint them all with the same brush, that they're all poor and all these poor folks just are having a heck of a time, there's more to the picture than the snapshot that Senator Chambers takes or the snapshot that Senator Pedersen has taken. I will support this bracket motion. If it fails, I will oppose LB 435. And I appreciate your time, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Mines. Senator Redfield.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the body, I seem to be mixed up in this bill, whether I like it or not, and so I feel that I should respond. I have a lot of empathy for the businesses that Senator Cunningham represents to us, because we sat here and we did the math and we calculated what his sales would have to increase in order to come up with the difference. And we basically, for one employee, if he was providing the benefits with all of the withholdings, he was
