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SENATOR BEUTLER:    Yeah, Mr. Speaker, Senator.

SENATOR REDFIELD:    Senator Beutler, would you be willing to amend that section dealing with school learners in...if we get past the bracket motion, perhaps on Select File, so that in fact this would be something that would be usable for people throughout the state where these programs aren't in existence?

SENATOR BEUTLER:    Senator, as I indicated to you, I'm very willing to look at that. As I also indicated to you, I haven't studied in detail the different approaches that might be taken to that.

SPEAKER BROMM:    One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER:    But I further indicated to you that my concern was less with the high school students than with people who have dependent and older people, that sort of thing. So I think that's one of the areas that we could work on and that I would be very interested in working on in good faith.

SENATOR REDFIELD:    Thank you very much, Senator Beutler. I think that we could make this bill palatable if we could address that. I'm not going to support the bracket motion. I think that we could do further work on the bill. I think people are worn down with the bill and maybe their minds are made up, but I think that we could address the timing for the implementation date. Certainly for the second piece we could address...

SPEAKER BROMM:    Time.

SENATOR REDFIELD:    Thank you very much.

SPEAKER BROMM:    Thank you, Senator.    (Visitors introduced.)  
Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT:    Mr. Speaker, I'd give my time to Senator Chambers.
