the bracket and supporting the bill, but I am standing today to speak about the people who have been dehumanized on this floor--the business owners who Senator Chambers talked about people being compelled to work for slave wages and that the businesses that are providing these jobs being hardhearted. Well, I want to tell a story about a friend of mine who is one of the most generous individuals I know. He has a small business, employs five people, and we were having conversation about taxes and healthcare costs and the kinds of decisions that go into every day running a business for him. And how...and maybe we can say that it's hardhearted for him to even look at the bottom line, except that if he doesn't look at the bottom line where are those five people going to be working? But he was in a position with the increase in healthcare costs and the possibility of an occupation tax, because that was what the conversation was about, in looking at having to get rid of one employee to be able to continue to make everything go. And the employee that he was having to look at was somebody that he had taken a risk on and this person had really risen to the occasion. And he was proud not only of what he was able to do by hiring her, but what she was able to do for herself and her family because of that job and because of the things that he had done consciously, both from a business standpoint but also from a human standpoint, in providing assistance so that she could continue her education and improve her skills. Now, she very well may be in the position that she is now able to move on someplace else, and I don't...I know that this bill is not going to impact her particular situation because he's paying far above minimum wage, but his decision making is not just about himself and how much money he can stuff in his pockets every night and go home. It is about keeping his business going for those employees. It's about everybody benefitting. And so I don't think that it's fair to characterize people who look at it from that perspective, who have to look at it, that they have to sign the paychecks and they have to make sure that there's enough money to pay everybody, that we can characterize them as hardhearted and that they are compelling people to work for them. He is providing five families with the ability to live and to actually improve their skills, and each one of our decisions...
