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SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Just so the record is clear, I rise in support of the rest of this legislation. I think they're excellent and I want to thank Senator Pederson, Senator Brown for bringing them forward, and of course Senator Brashear for his work on it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Senator Combs.

SENATOR COMBS: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I wondered, Senator Brown, could you answer a question for me, please? Maybe you answered this when I was out in the hall, but...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brown, would you respond?

SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR COMBS: I just wondered does the term "nurse," does that include advanced practice, the nurse practitioners that are working in clinics too? I just wanted to clarify that for our nurses.

SENATOR BROWN: Yes, it does include nurse practitioners.

SENATOR COMBS: Wonderful. Thank you so much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Combs. Senator Brown, did you wish to speak? Your light is on. Thank you. Any further discussion? Senator Redfield.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the body, I rise in support of this amendment. I think that the bills that are before us are very important and certainly warrant our attention, especially Senator Brown's bill. I know of an instance in my district. There is a doctor. His wife is also a physician and she has chosen at this time to stay home with her children and raise them through the preschool years. But she has a lot of skill, she has a lot of training, and she is completely fluent in a foreign language. That would be very valuable in a clinic. And this is someone who would like very much to volunteer her services during this time frame when she
