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SENATOR CHAMBERS:      I don't have any idea what you're talking about.

SENATOR STUHR:      All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      And I'm not trying to be facetious.

SENATOR STUHR:      Yes. Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      So should I ask him?

SENATOR STUHR:      Yes. Would you, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Yes I will.

SENATOR STUHR:      Uh-huh.

SENATOR CUDABACK:      Senator Raikes, would you respond?

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      I'd like to ask Senator Raikes a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK:      Would you respond, Senator Raikes?

SENATOR RAIKES:      Yes I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Senator Raikes, would you explain why this word "maximum" is being inserted, and exactly what it refers to?

SENATOR RAIKES:      Senator, "maximum" would deal with the dollar amount that could be charged for a particular fee. It has been the policy of the...well, the committee and the Legislature, that there would be public disclosure on any fees charged. First of all, there's been the lean, or the bent, if you will, that in public schools, less fees are preferred to more fees. If you are going to charge a fee, you need to say exactly, in detail, what the fee is for and how much the fee is. One of the complaints, or one of the issues raised, I guess I would say, in the discussion of this, is, well, what if it would change during the course of the year, a particular fee requirement? We would have to reissue our fee policy...
