to buy a T-shirt or something. In senior high it may cost \$30. What we are trying to attempt to do is say that the board, in the policies, it will list the maximum amount that will be charged for that particular activity. Which may be that \$30. But in junior high, they actually may only be charging \$10. I hope that clarifies. Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Stuhr, what I'm understanding from what you're saying is that there might be one fee in junior high of a certain amount, and for the same type of activity in senior high there is a different fee...I mean a different fee amount for it.

SENATOR STUHR: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So rather than disclose that the fee in junior high is \$10 and the fee for senior high is \$30, they will just list a fee of \$30, which would then allow them to charge \$30 in junior high if they chose to.

SENATOR STUHR: May I respond?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, it's your time. I'm just ask...

SENATOR STUHR: Because actually, I'm not sure how the schools write the policy. There might be 16 different groups in senior high. But the level of fee that is needed in those 16 groups in senior high might be different. I think that was the attempt, to always include the maximum amount.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Which senior high has 15 different music groups...

SENATOR STUHR: I don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...for which fees would be charged at a differing rate?

SENATOR STUHR: I...
