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the body. I passed out to you the blue copy. You have before you the statutes relating to the enrollment option program. I thought that might be helpful in the fact that it does list some definitions, it does list actually the portion of the bill that we are addressing this afternoon. I also did just want to mention again that March 15 date. I did agree that we would leave that date in. And you have that explanation on your white sheet that is before you. As I said, we are dealing with about 15,000 students that option in and out of a school district. And in order for schools to make the very best use of the resources that they have, they felt that this date was necessary. But most important, we are adding the July 1 ineligibility date in place of the waiver system that is now in effect. So I hope that that helps you to understand what we are trying to accomplish in this bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Price and Senator Stuhr. Senator Hartnett, followed by Senator Schimek.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Stuhr, can I ask you some questions? You have...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...listed a long list of activities here, in the 90 days...and I thought I heard someone say, maybe incorrectly, that the Activities Association now has a 90-day waiver...or, waiting period, if they...is that in the Activities Association rules, that if you transfer after July 1 you're ineligible for 90 days? Is that true?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuhr, would you respond?

SENATOR STUHR: I'm not sure that...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: ...they have it in their bylaws as yet. As I stated before, I think over 240 of the school districts would like that date...that July 1 date added to the option enrollment statutes.
