ensure that the Lincoln students were treated the same as other students. In other words, a student who transferred in from Waverly would not be treated any differently than a student that transfers between Lincoln East and Lincoln Southeast. We could do that in statute. Right?

SENATOR STUHR: We could. But I would not be supporting that, because I believe that we need to have a hearing on the issue. Plus, we do not have the transfer issue in statute right now.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: But would it (inaudible)...?

SENATOR STUHR: (Inaudible) not even sure where it...I don't even know where it would fall.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Would it be not those schools that have transfer students that would be anxious to get this into statute? Or, let me ask you another question. Could they not go to the NSAA and get the rules changed for transfer students then?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR STUHR: That would certainly be, I believe, the first choice between now and next session.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. I...and I'm not going to belabor the point, Senator Stuhr. I think that something probably does need to be done to make it equitable for all students. But I'm not sure if it should be done here on this bill, or if it should be done by other means. And I just wanted to explore that with you. So thank you very much.
