SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Ch, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers and Senator Hartnett. Senator Beutler on FA1318.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Raikes, could I engage you further in a little more conversation?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Hartnett has very clearly pointed out the potential unfairness of a 90-day rule that just begins at the beginning of the academic session and goes on, in the sense that if the intention that I had in transferring was to be on a great baseball team, or to have a great baseball coach, for example, the 90-day rule wouldn't keep me from satisfying that intention in any way, would it?

SENATOR RAIKES: I think you're correct, Senator. I think that...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Any sport...

SENATOR RAIKES: ...something that...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...that takes place in the spring, or in the second semester, is not going to be affected by that 90-day rule, right?

SENATOR RAIKES: That's correct. My understanding is, that's correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So we have this huge disproportionate treatment depending on what the interest of the student is, even within sports, much less other extracurricular activities, with
