SENATOR STUHR: No. All right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Sorry.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay. Again, I want to just reemphasize that what we are attempting to do on this bill is actually to discourage students optioning from one school district to another for extracurricular purposes, that by setting the deadline in statute as July 1, this helps everyone understand that in regards to extracurricular activities, which are a privilege, they would not be eligible if they did that after July 1. So I believe...again, the point that I want to emphasize is that we passed in 1989...and maybe some of you were around when the student option enrollment program was passed. And we have all of those, as you have on your desk, the blue copy, statutes dealing with the option student program. We had a waiver provision. What...about 250 schools, member schools, would like to see some changes in the statute. We haven't revisited this issue for ten years. And this is what we are attempting to do, like we do in other legislation, is, after some time, you review it. They would like to see that July 1 deadline put in the statutes in regard to the option enrollment program. With that, I'll give the rest of my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. We are still debating the first component of the divided Stuhr amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to ask Senator Raikes a couple of questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Raikes, when we deal with these transfers, we're not involved with altruism, where a receiving school just has such good programs and a sending school lacks
