SENATOR HARTNETT: Why do we have to worry about ineligibility at all? We're...aren't we concerned about education programs, or not? Or is this trying to limit...?

SENATOR STUHR: No, we're actually trying to put more of an emphasis on education, and to stop that waiver process that they do now...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Well then...

SENATOR STUHR: ...for...possibly for student participation in athletics.
