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SENATOR STUHR: I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you're not telling us that the majority wants this, wh...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, I think...I think that's how we operate in this Legislature.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All I am doing is asking you, is that why...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you're telling us that because you believe in the majority should rule.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, yes, I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now I have another question. If Mr. Bush did not get a majority of the votes, why should he be President?

SENATOR STUHR: I believe he did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, he didn't, but that's okay. That's in a forum beyond ours. Now I want to ask you something serious on the bill. Senator Stuhr, when you were talking to Senator Mines, you mentioned...he was asking why couldn't this stuff about this extracurricular participation and so forth be done administratively through that school organization, and you had indicated that it's already in statute. And when you said that, he backed off. But if it's already in statute, why are we putting it in statute now?

SENATOR STUHR: Senator Chambers, we are changing the ineligibility consideration of looking at that waiver. Right now there is the waiver between the two schools and that is what we are changing and taking out of statute and establishing the dates.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the waiver referred specifically to participation in extracurricular activities?
