SENATOR RAIKES: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...from ground zero.

SENATOR RAIKES: Let me suggest that that is not what is intended, if I understand your question correctly. That is,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...we might...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...a proposal in the fee policy of a school is that we might ask for fees amounting to no more than \$250. That is not to be allowed by this. This is simply to say to not back away at all from the notion that you're stating specifically and in detail exactly what it is you're requiring the fee for, and the only thing that you would...that there would be reason for maximum would be that the price may vary, the price of that specific detailed item may vary from the time you write the fee policy until, in fact, you would have to collect the fees. There is...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: From whom is the item to be purchased?

SENATOR RAIKES: I'm guessing, Senator, it would depend on whatever supplier may be involved.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR RAIKES: For example, suppose there is a fee, and I hope I'm not get...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: He said our time is up.

SENATOR RAIKES: Oh, I'm sorry.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.
